

Oral History Telephone Telephones

Some years ago, ATS were approached by a client to make a simple phone that could play an oral history track when the receiver was lifted.

As is typical at ATS we managed to go an extra step and designed a system allowing the user to "dial" up to 125 tracks.

It is a perfect way to deliver Oral History and we have provided these to many heritage sites all over the UK.

The system consists of:

A modified telephone (you can choose the model), with a volume control (for visitors) fitted at the back. The telephone is connected to a single grey control box that can be hidden and is 285mm (L) x 111mm (W) x 50mm (D).

The control box uses a DC power supply to operate; all you will need to provide is an electrical supply.

Other features

For that authentic look you could provide a list of tracks in an 'Old Style' typeface and use an appropriate 3 digit code on the centre of the dial.

Dial Tone

For those old enough to remember these telephones we have added an authentic dialtone when you lift the receiver.

Update yourself

The system allows you to load the tracks using a simple software interface. The new tracks are then loaded onto a flash card which is installed in the control box.



Radios

We are not just restricted to phones.

ATS will even create authentic 'mood' music or a loop of tracks appropriate for the period.
